# consequent

I. happening as a result of a particular event or situation

*Weather forecasters predicted heavy rain and consequent flooding.*



*Falling sales and a consequent loss of profits forced the company to lay off more workers.*



# construct

1. to build something such as a house, bridge, road etc.

*The city plans to construct more roads.*



2. to make or create (something, such as a story or theory) by organizing ideas, words, etc.

*The author constructs all the stories around one theme.*



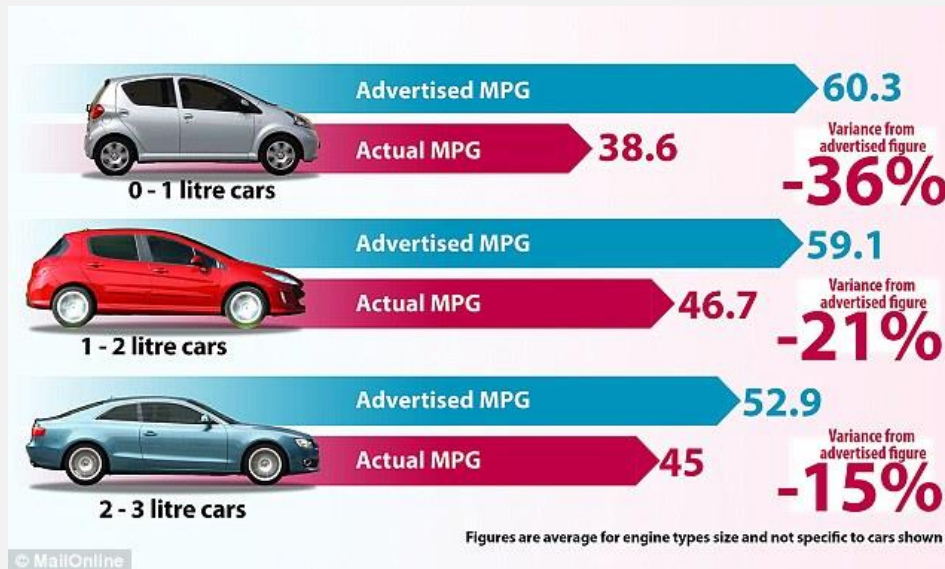
# consume

1. to use time, energy, goods etc.

*Smaller cars consume less fuel.*

2. if a feeling or idea consumes you, it affects you very strongly, so that you cannot think about anything else

*He was consumed with guilt after the accident.*



# credit

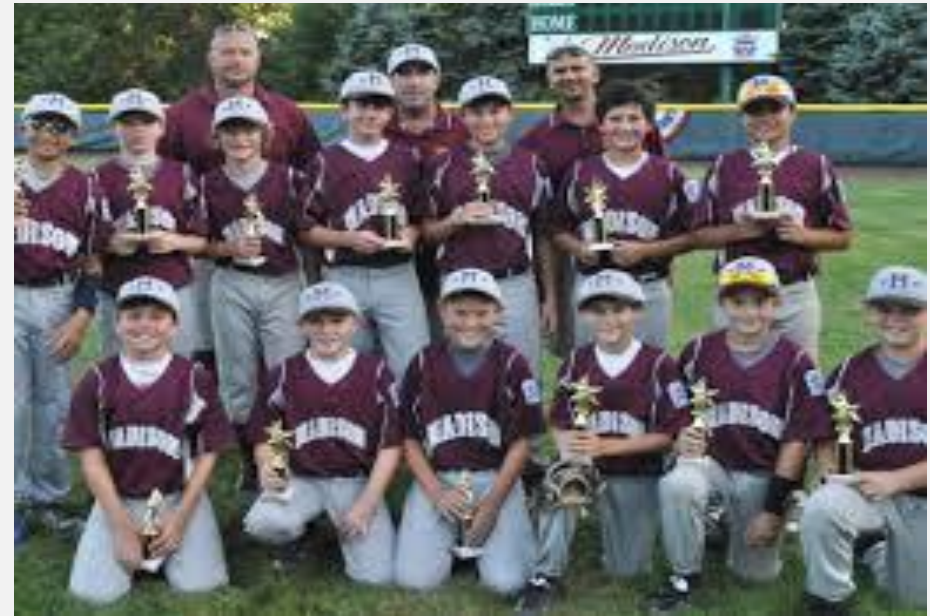
1. an arrangement with a shop, bank etc that allows you to buy something and pay for it later

*Most new cars are bought on credit.*



2. approval or praise that you give to someone for something they have done

*Credit for this win goes to everybody in the team.*



# culture

1. the beliefs, way of life, art, and customs that are shared and accepted by people in a particular society

*In our culture, it is rude to ask someone how much they earn.*

2. a society that existed at a particular time in history

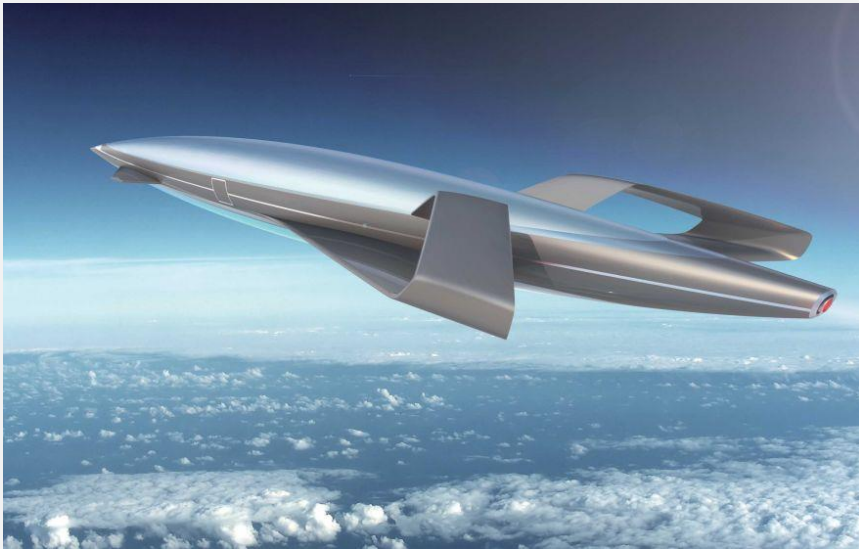
*The Egyptian culture relied upon the Nile Delta.*



# design

1. the art or process of making a drawing of something to show how you will make it or what it will look like

The new plane is in its final design stage.



2. a pattern for decorating something

*The sofa is covered in a lovely, floral-design fabric.*



# distinct

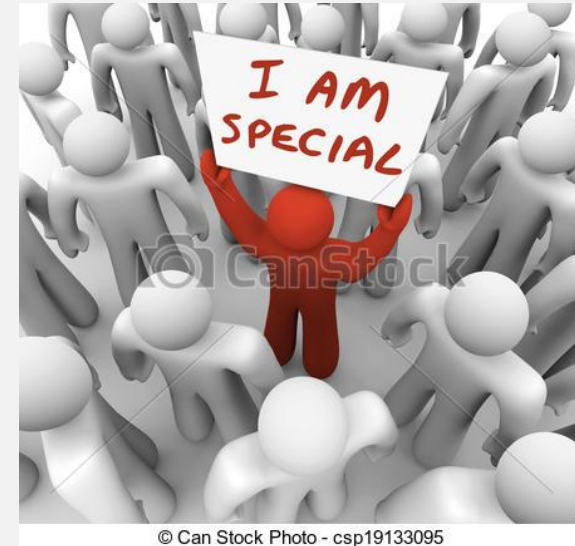
I. clearly different or belonging to a different type

*Although they share many things in common, Portuguese and Spanish are two entirely distinct languages.*



2. used to make it clear that you are not referring to a particular kind of thing, but to something else

*Kim Kardashian is a TV star, as distinct from an actor.*

# element

1. one part or feature of a whole system, plan, piece of work etc, especially one that is basic or important

*Honesty is a vital element of her success.*

2. an amount, usually small, of a quality or feeling:

*There is an element of truth in your argument.*



# equate

1. to consider that two things are similar or connected

*Most people equate wealth with success.*



2. to be equal to something:

*With benefits, he receives a rate of pay which equates to \$40.00 an hour.*



# evaluate

I. to judge how good, useful, or successful something is; assess

*You should be able to evaluate your own work.*

*We need to evaluate the success of the campaign.*
