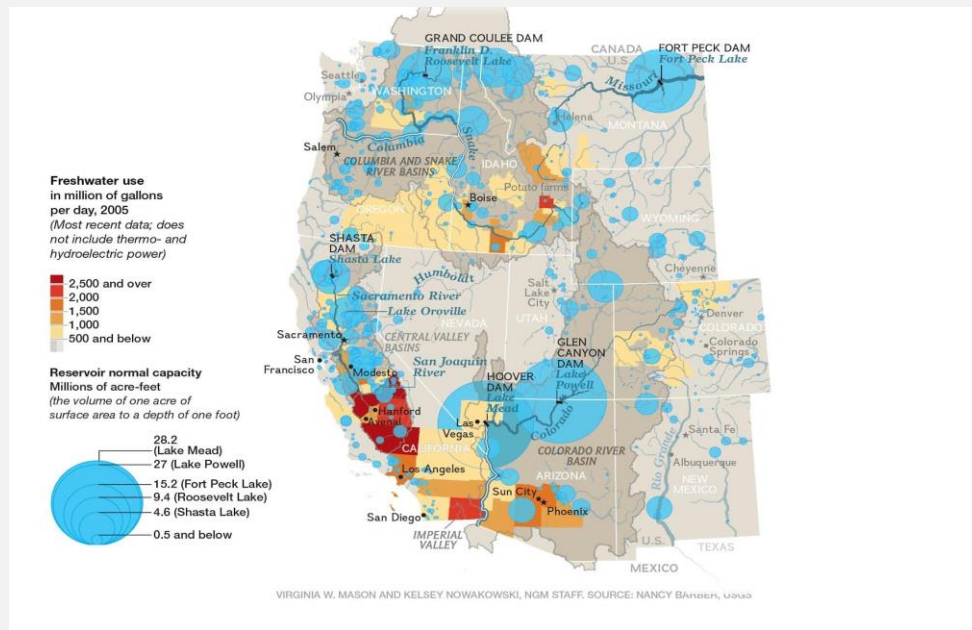
region

1. A large area of a country or of the world, usually without exact limits [= area]:

Efforts to bring fresh water to the flooded region failed.

2. a particular part of someone's body [= area]:

He complained of pain in the lower back region.



regulate

1. to control an activity or process, especially by rules:

The FDA imposes strict rules regulating the use of chemicals in food.



2. to make a machine or your body work at a particular speed, temperature etc:

People sweat to regulate their body heat.



relevant

1. directly relating to the subject or problem being discussed or considered

Relevant documents were presented in court.

reside

1. to live in a particular place:

He spent most of his time in Los Angeles, where his family resided.



2. to be present in or consist of something:

Joe's talent resides in his storytelling abilities.



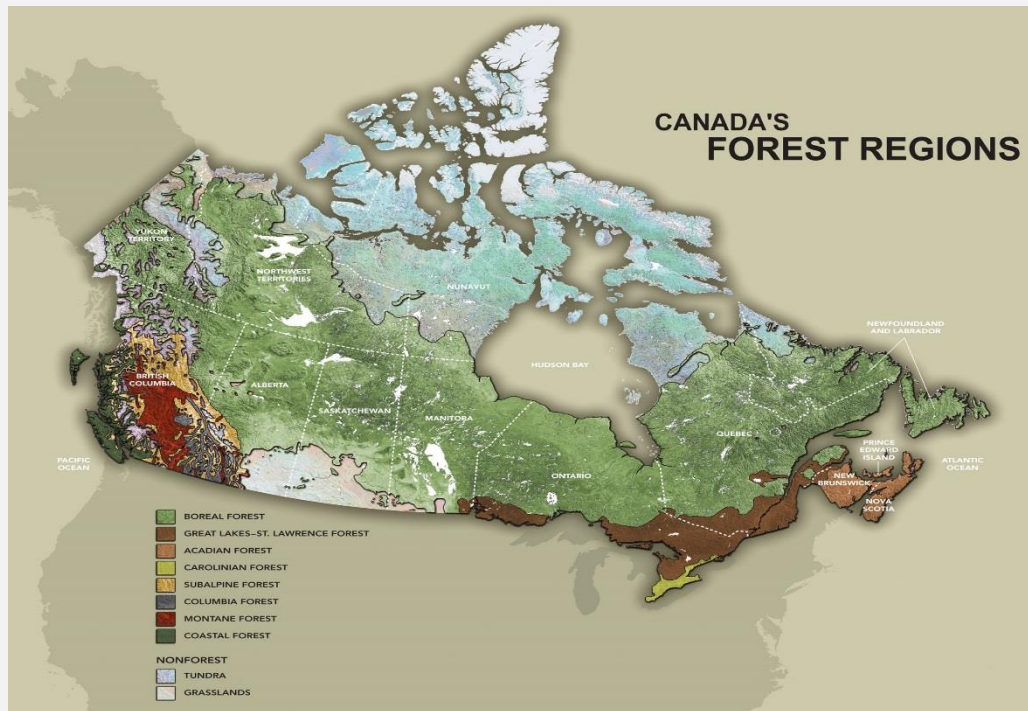
resource

1. something such as useful land, or minerals such as oil or coal, that exists in a country and can be used to increase its wealth:

.The forests of Canada are the most important natural resource in the country

2. all the money, property, skills etc that you have available to use when you need them:

She had no financial resources.



restrict

1. to limit or control the size, amount, or range of something:

The new law restricts the sale of hand guns.



2. to limit someone's actions or movements:

The cramped living conditions severely restricted the children's freedom to play.



secure

1. a situation that is secure is one that you can depend on because it is not likely to change:

We want a secure future for our children.



2. to get or achieve something that will be permanent, especially after a lot of effort:

The goalie's efforts secured the team's spot in the World Cup.



seek

1. to try to achieve or get something:

Do you think the President will seek re-election?



2. to ask someone for advice or help:

If the symptoms persist, seek medical advice.



select

1. to choose something or someone by thinking carefully about which is the best, most suitable etc.

He selected the college based on its engineering program.



2. a select group of people or things is a small special group that has been chosen carefully:

Scholarships are handed out to a select group of students.



site

1. a place where something important or interesting happened:

The rescue team was taken to the site of the crash.



2. to place or build something in a particular place
be sited in/on/at/near etc something

Some of the new housing has been sited in inner city areas.
